**Tories targetting deadbeat parents**

Halton North MPP Ted Chudleigh says the provincial government's electronic system for transferring and enforcing family support payments is hugely successful. Collected payments in November set a record, totaling 40,960 and representing a dollar increase of more than 33 per cent from \$31 million in Nov. 1994 to \$41.6 million in Nov. 1998.

"All we ask is for people to accept their legal responsibilities to family members," said Chudleigh, in a press release. "This system makes matching collections to payments much quicker and easier. It also increases enforcement of those obligations through meaningful penalties."

As a method of enforcement, the Family Responsibility Office is targeting the driver's licence renewals, passports and credit history of people delinquent in payments. Since the fall of 1997, 3,652 driver's licence suspension notices were sent out and 1,211 licences were suspended. The threat of suspension collected \$5.5 million for families, Chudleigh said.

As well, it's expected that this spring private collection agencies will be "on the trail" of more than 20,000 of the worst deadbeat parents, he said.
