## Everyone will be gunning for the Georgetown Wolfpack

here's a new game rolling into town. The Georgetown Wolfpack, a Jr. A roller hockey team, will play out of the Alcott Arena this summer.

The Major Jr. A Roller Hockey team is being brought here by Paul Mintha, who started up the roller hockey house league program in Georgetown two years ago. After playing in Scarborough the past two years, the team is moving to Georgetown after Mintha arranged sponsorships with Charley FitzWhiskey's and Galvcast.

The Wolfpack enter their first season in town as the defending champions after defeating Niagara in the Walter Gretzky Cup final. That means everyone in the 14their sights set on the Wolfpack this season.

"They can gun for us all they want," said Frank Tullio, a defenceman for the Caledon Canadians in the Provincial Jr. A Hockey League, "they're still not going to beat us."

Mintha is a little more cautious in his optimism. He said the league's profile is growing and teams have added Ontario Hockey League players to make a run at the championship. Among those recruited for the coming season are the Sault Ste. Marie's Adam Nittel (Kitchener), London's Tom Kostopoulos (Mississauga) and Barrie's Michael Henrich (York Region).

Not to be outdone, the Wolfpack have

added Sudbury Wolves' defenceman Kevin Beaumont, whose brother Jason Beaumont also plays on the team.

Defence won't be a big priority in the offence-oriented game, though.

"It's true run and gun hockey," Mintha said.

"We guarantee the fans excitement if they come out and watch," said Mike Farrugia, a 40-goal scorer with the Wolfpack last season.

The team will play an 18-game season with the home opener set for Saturday, May 8 at 5:30 p.m. at the Alcott Arena.


The Wolfpack will be holding open tryouts on Wednesday, Apr. 28 from 9 to team, two-conference league will have '10:30 p.m. and Saturday, May 1 from 1:30 to 3 p.m. at Memorial Arena. A third tryout will be held Sunday, May 2 from 2 to 3:30 p.m. at Alcott Arena. The league is open to players 16-21.

> "Any skilled player in ice hockey is going to shine in roller hockey," Mintha said. "The skills are easily transferrable."




