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Council okays 20-year plan

Halton Hills council has approved the town's new Strategic Plan for the next 20 years.

The plan, called Future Directions— Action for Five, Vision for Twenty— was approved by council Monday night. The document has six key components, each followed by a list of actions: preserve and enhance our natural environment and cultural heritage; provide services to support our quality of life; manage growth, foster a prosperous economy; work together as one town and deliver responsive and effective municipal government.

Few changes were requested by councillors, at the general committee meeting last week, to be added to the final draft. Ward 2 Councillor Kathy Gastle requested Chief Administrative Officer Steve Andrews set up a committee to establish environmental protection policies to be included during the next month's Official Plan review. As well, she suggested ward boundary changes be also investigated.

Acton Councillor Norm Elliott wanted a disclaimer placed in the document saying that the actions listed are not ranked in priority.


Councillor Jane Fogal said people will be pleased with what they see in the document which contains many positive actions.

Copies of the strategic plan are available at the Civic Centre and it will also be included on the town's Web site: www.town.halton-hills.on.ca.

Town staff will now develop an implementation work plan for all the 72 actions contained in the report.

The strategic plan was developed by council, town staff and more than 100 residents.





General Committee for the Town of Halton Hills will conduct a Public Meeting to examine and discuss proposed amendments to Zoning By-law 57-91 and two related applications for plans of subdivision. The first application (Region of Halton File 24T-86035B/H - Halton Hills Village Homes Inc.), proposes the creation of 458 single detached residential lots, 11 residential reserve blocks, 3 neighbourhood park blocks, 2 stormwater management blocks and 3 open space blocks. One of the Open Space blocks has an area of 66.895 hectares and contains a portion of the Hungry Hollow valley feature, including Silver Creek, and is not subject to development. The second application (Region of Halton File 24T-89013/H - Silver Creek Estates), proposes the creation of 35 single detached residential lots, 17 residential reserve blocks and one open space block.

The subject properties are located in Georgetown South and are bounded by Eighth Line (Main Street) to the west, existing residential development to the north and east, existing and proposed plans of subdivision to the south (D12/HVHI - 10) and agricultural lands and proposed plans of subdivision to the west (D12/Verdeux and D12/Arbor Valley).

The public is invited to attend the meeting to ask questions and provide comments. If a person or public body that files an appeal of a decision of the Town of Halton Hills in respect of the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment does not make oral submissions at a public meeting, or written submissions, to the Town of Halton Hills before the proposed zoning by-law is adopted, the Ontario Municipal Board may dismiss all or part of the appeal.
