Local taxes expected to rise by \$11

A s it stands now, the average Halton Hills homeowner is facing about an \$11 hike in their property taxes this year.

That will mean a homeowner with a home assessed at \$185,000 (1996 values) should see his/her annual property tax bill jump from \$2,659 to \$2,670, or less than half a per cent on the total bill over last year.

Halton Hills budget committee approved the town's \$12.1 million 1999 operating budget Wednesday night. The region's budget was also approved Wednesday and the town's \$7.3 million capital budget was approved earlier.

Approximately \$9 of the hike is a result of a 1.2 per cent increase in the town's budget, and the remaining \$2 on the bill is due to the fact Halton Region, which came in with a 3.1 per cent decrease in its budget, couldn't cover the entire \$780,000 reduction in community reinvestment funding the town was dealt from the province.

Town treasurer Ed DeSousa, said the projected increase is the best current estimate and he is expected to get firmer numbers from the region before the May 3 special council meeting, where the budget is expected to be ratified by council.

DeSousa said early indications are the education tax rate won't change from last year, but if it does it will impact tax bills.

The town's budget includes the hiring of six new employees including a director of Recreation and Parks, a public works supervisor and two new planners. The 1999 impact to the town of additional staff related costs will be in the \$263,000 range.


Councillor Ron Chatten was adamantly opposed to the staff additions.
