

Meetings galore set for next week

The week ahead will be busy for residents with a numerous information meetings being held on housing proposals and road reconstruction.

Monday night, Halton Hills council hosts a public information meeting at the Georgetown District High School on a Halton Hills Village Homes Inc. (HHVHI) and Silver Creek Estates proposal to build 503 single-detached homes on Main St. S. lands bordering the Hungry Hollow ravine. HHVHI has already referred this proposal to the Ontario Municipal Board (OMB), which make the final decision.

Citizens' group Save Our Ravines (SOR), which already has a 1,000-name petition, is opposing the proposal.

The public meeting will be held at 7 p.m. in the school cafeteria. as the town expects a large turnout. If a person does not speak at the information meeting or provide a written submission to the town, the OMB may dismiss their complaint.

Also on Monday, the OMB hearing on the Dominion Seed House lands begins at 10 a.m. at the Halton Hills Civic Centre and is expected to last five days. In January, developer Parallax Land Corporation appealed a town decision placing several conditions on the property. Last week town revised its position somewhat, lessening some of the conditions and removing a condition to convey land for a new town fire station. OMB meetings are open to the public.

On Tuesday night, from 5-7 p.m., Halton Region will host a public meeting on the Princess Anne pumping station upgrade. That meeting will be held at Park School.

On Wednesday, from 5-8 p.m. at Ballinafad Community Centre, Halton Region will also host an information meeting on roadway improvements of Trafalgar Rd. North, from Hwy. 7 to Ballinafad Rd.

The region is now in the preliminary design stage with construction expected to begin in 2000.

Further to the completion of the Environmental Assessment in July 1998, the Regional Municipality of Halton is proceeding with the preliminary design to reconstruct Trafalgar Road to a two-lane roadway within the above-noted project limits in order to provide improvements to roadway geometry, sight distance, safety and pavement structure. Construction is tentatively scheduled for the year 2000. A Public Information Centre will be held:

This meeting will be of specific interest to those owners and tenants whose properties front onto Trafalgar Road or are near the intersections of Trafalgar Road/Highway 7, Trafalgar Road/No. 27 Side Road, Trafalgar Road/Southwinds Dr. and Trafalgar Road/Ballinafad Road.
