At Oldtimers tournament

Goalie battle won by Bulldogs

Old Gems goalie Glenn Tost turned in an outstanding performance only to be topped by his counterpart.

Matt Ducharme of The Bulldogs blanked the Gems in the Over-35 final of the Sports Unlimited Oldtimers Hockey Tournament last weekend to lead his team to a 1-0 victory. Ducharme allowed only two goals in four games to win the tournament's most valuable player award.

Lorne Morrison was the only player to get a puck past Tost in the championship game. He scored with 12:33 to play in the second and final period.

R.P.I. looked to have the 40-and-over A Division wrapped up but the Weston Old Hacks struck for four goals in the last five minutes to steal a 5-3 victory. Leading the comeback was Luch Digesseppi, who scored three times.

Bob Marshall scored twice and set up two more to lead the Cavaliers to a 5-3 win over Terry's Pirates in the 40-

and-over B division.

Another goaltending battle was featured in the 50-and-over A Division championship. John Ritchie's goal late in the first period was the game's only tally as Paul Pendergast backstopped Tottenham to a 1-0 win over New-market's Bradscott. Pendergast was named the tournament's best representative of oldtimer's hockey.

Butterworth was chosen for competing with partner Kara Edwards at the Halton championships at Notre Dame in the mixed doubles badminton competition.

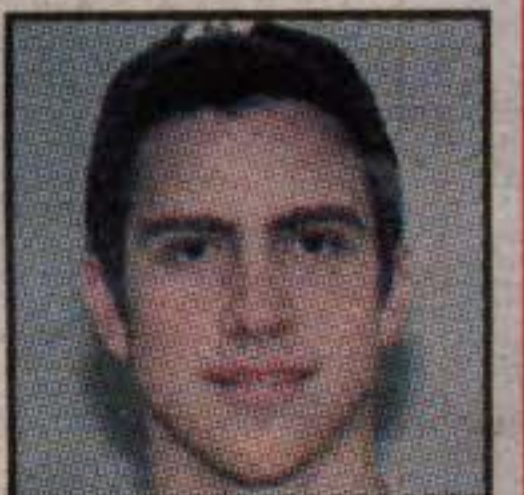
Acton High School Athletes of the Week are Andrew Watson and Meghen Verheul.

Watson, a member of the junior Redmen badminton team, was chosen for winning four of five matches in the North Halton Junior Championships at AHS last week.



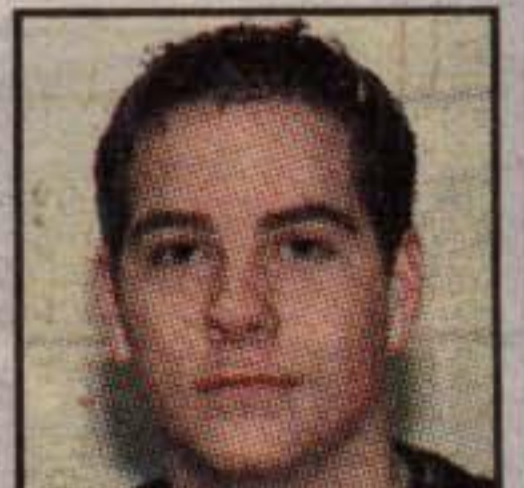
