

You are required to have a licence to fish unless you are under 18 years old, 65 years or older, or you are a disabled person who is an Ontario resident. If you are a Canadian resident you need a Resident Fishing Licence (\$21.00 or \$15.00 with a valid Outdoors Card) or a Resident Conservation Licence which has reduced catch and possession limits (\$13.50 or \$7.50 with an Outdoor Card).
