ATTENTION DOG OWNERS

Effective July 1, 1999 the annual dog license fee for a first time purchase will be increased from \$20.00 to \$30.00. First time licenses are available from veterinarians in Halton Hills and from the Town office.

Annual renewals will remain at \$20.00 if purchased by the renewal date. Renewals are only available for purchase at the Town office or by mail. Licenses, which are not renewed by the renewal date, will be treated as a first-time license purchase at a cost of \$30.00.

Optional lifetime licenses are available for a one-time fee of \$40.00 provided the dog has had a microchip implant prior to the purchase of this license.

A rabies vaccination (within the last 12 months) is required before any first time license or renewal . is purchased.

Parent school group wants town to pressure school board on closures

Talton Hills council has requested its staff to investigate the Limpact of Halton District School Board's decision not to close three schools.

Councillor Jane Fogal said she had been contacted by the newly formed Georgetown and Rural Joint School Council Committee requesting the town write to the Ministry of Education in support of the group's effort to overturn a board decision not to close schools in south Halton. Without the school closures, the Halton board can not reduce its pupil places capacity to the point where the provincial government will fund new schools.

Mayor Marilyn Serjeantson is sending the letter to the Ministry and will attach the committee's letter to it.

The group also wants the town to consider development control measures limiting development until new schools

could be built. They also request the town to place signs at new developments saying there are no schools in those neighbor-

In addition, the committee wants the town to look at legal recourse against the school board's trustees.

The letter will be referred to staff to study the implications of the board's decision to be followed up with recommendations for town action.

However, Ward 4 Councillor Ron Chatten said "They (the committee) have a school board and elected trustees. Let's not take on their job as well. There's a process in place for getting new schools. They should get all the parents together and go down and pound the streets at the Singleton Centre (the board's headquarters). We're not going to make much difference and we all know that. They've got to get organized and get down there."
