## Blues on the Rocks is back by popular demand

Back by popular demand Halton Museum Foundation presents the second Blues on the Rocks— a Blues night and southern-style dinner.

Join Dennis Gomo, feature entertainer on Saturday, May 8, 6-11 p.m. Gomo, a Guelph-based musician, has been playing to audiences across southern Ontario for more than 15 years. He performs both originals and his own interpretations of cover songs on guitar, harmonica and dobro.

Gomo's first CD, Hiding out in Limbo, co-produced by Jeff Bird (Cowboy Junkies), has been well received and has had some good exposure on both local and national radio.




