

Yellow canoes mark the way to Riverfest in Norval this Saturday

Norval is the place to be this Saturday, May 15 when Riverfest '99 will be held, rain or shine.

The purpose of Riverfest is to celebrate life on the Credit River, to help people to learn about the outdoors including threatened and endangered species, to raise awareness about the importance of protecting waterways, to raise funds for the Norval Community Association and the new Willow Park Ecology Centre, to boost local business, to draw attention to the many attractions that Norval has to offer, and most of

all—to have some fun!

Yellow canoes will mark posts leading people to the different attractions that will be spread throughout the village. The main activities will take place from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m., however garage sales at all three churches begin at 8:30 a.m.

Live jazz, a Riverfest dinner and a volleyball tournament is scheduled at Hollywood House from 4-8 p.m.

Activities include canoe building, chainsaw carving of a six foot black bear, decoy carving and fly tying demonstrations.

Credit Valley Conservation will provide information on the Credit River watershed, Halton Region will show their ground-water display and the Credit River Anglers Association will attend with a live fish aquarium and demonstrations at the river. Flyfishing and catch & release techniques will be demonstrated by the Izaak Walton Flyfishing Club and the Brimstone Angler.

Acton BIA will attend with their Victorian kid's playhouse while the Norval Community Association will sell boxed lunches for riverside picnics. The

association will also provide guided tours of the Lucy Maud Montgomery garden, dedicated to former Norval resident, the famed Canadian author of Anne of Green Gables.

Members of the Town Environmental Advisory Committee (TEAC) will host guided tours of the Willow Park Ecology Centre where Wye Marsh Wildlife Centre will present their Wet & Scaly display of live snakes and amphibians. Activities there will include making Japanese fish kites, a Birds of Prey demonstration, a

St. John Ambulance wilderness survival display and a Maple Lodge barbecue with part of the proceeds going to park's rehabilitation.

Maps of attraction locations and self-guided walking tours will be available at the Norval Convenience Store and Canoe Country one week prior to the event and during Riverfest.

Parking is available at Norval Park, the Hollywood House and Canoe Country.

Wheelchair accessible wash-room facilities are available at the Norval Park.



ONTARIO PROVINCIAL ELECTION

It's Different This Time!

WE'RE USING A NEW WAY TO PREPARE THE VOTERS LIST FOR THIS ELECTION.

It's called the Permanent Register of Electors for Ontario and it means that *most* Ontario residents won't have enumerators knocking at their door this time.

REVISING AGENTS MAY CALL DOOR-TO-DOOR

In some areas where there has recently been a significant change in population, it may be necessary to complete a limited door-to-door canvass to identify eligible voters. In these cases, revising agents from Elections Ontario, working in teams of two, will be calling on residences to confirm voter eligibility. If the revising agents come to your door, please make them welcome.

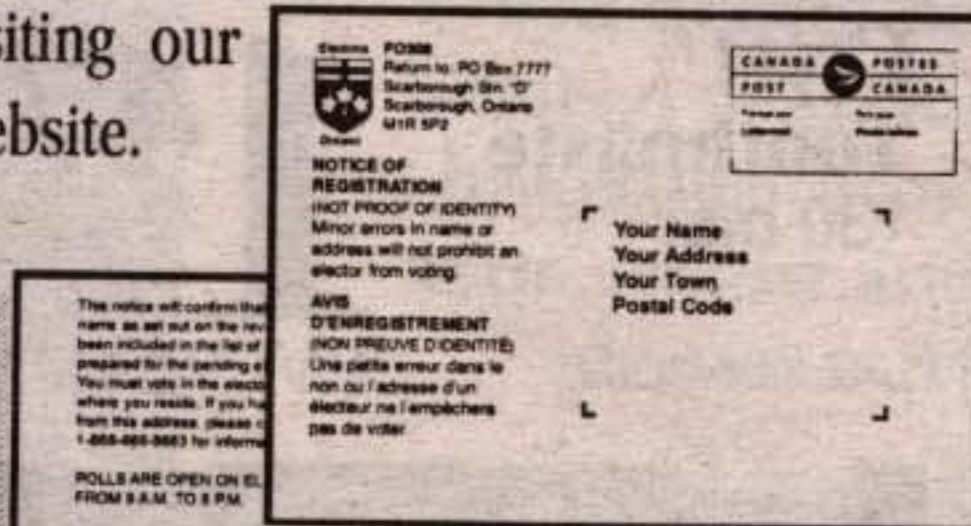
NOTICE OF REGISTRATION CARDS WILL BE MAILED

The names of *most* qualified voters in Ontario will already be included on the Voters List for this election as a result of information contained in the Permanent Register of Electors for Ontario. Those voters will receive a Notice of Registration card by mail. This card will confirm that they are on the Voters List, and it will provide their electoral district and the location of the poll where they will vote on election day.

IF YOU DO NOT RECEIVE A NOTICE OF REGISTRATION CARD

If you are qualified to vote and have NOT received your notification card within TWO WEEKS, contact your local returning office for information on how to protect your right to vote on election day. Returning office locations and telephone numbers may be obtained by calling Elections Ontario or by visiting our website.

NEW ELECTORAL DISTRICTS

The boundaries for electoral districts in Ontario provincial elections have changed. The number of electoral districts has been reduced from 130 to 103 and boundaries are now the same as those for federal elections.

You may confirm your electoral district by calling Elections Ontario or by visiting our website.

QUALIFICATIONS TO VOTE

To be eligible to vote, on polling day a person must be:

- 18 years of age,
- a Canadian citizen, and
- a resident of the electoral district.

Persons who ceased to live in Ontario within the two years before polling day may be entitled to vote under certain conditions. Call us for further information.
