Take a hike—on the Escarpment Sunday

Escarpment bluffs near Milton? Join a two-hour guided spring hike presented by the Halton Region Museum in Kelso Conservation Area on Sunday, May 16.

The hike departs at 10 a.m. from the Halton Region Museum. Com-fortable shoes and water bottles are recommended. Hikers will wind their way up the Bruce Trail to the tip of Milton Heights. Be sure to bring a camera.

Hike leader Bill Brown of the Bruce Trail Association will be on hand to point out the many sights and sounds of spring in the woods. A stop will be made the historic Christie-Henderson Lime Kilns. Two of the fieldstone kilns stand 55 feet tall at the base of the Escarpment. For 40 years, lime was extracted at this site by burning limestone in the kilns at temperatures of 1300-1800F. Today the woods have encroached on the once state-ofthe-art manufacturing complex.

Back at the Halton Region Museum, hikers are invited for refreshments and an informative Niagara Escarpment presentation. Bring along a packed lunch and picnic on the scenic grounds.

Fees for the guided hike are \$5 per participant plus admission into Kelso Conservation Area of \$3.25 for adults, \$2.75 for seniors and students and \$2.25 for children. The Museum's Exhibits Building will be open for visitors

to enjoy at no additional charge.
