Choral Society presents powerful performance

Choral music is not extremely popular and enjoys only a limited following. Many people would, in fact, turn their noses up at the prospect of attending an evening of classical music. But one doesn't listen to choral music, so much as feel it. It paints a picture in one's mind, and releases a plethora of emotions with every turn of the score.

This power of music was fully experienced in Georgetown's Knox Church Friday night, where the acoustics enhanced both the vocals and the accompaniment during Georgetown Choral Society's spring concert, A Choral Celebration.

The first half consisted of a rendition of Mass in D (Opus 86) by Antonin Dvorak, and provided an opportunity for the choir to realize its full potential, especially when accompanied by the Talisker Players, a sextet consisting of violin, viola, cello, harp, and percussion.

Under the accompaniment of organist Christopher Dawes and directorship of A. Dale Woods, the groups' performance is certainly top notch. But with the addition of the Talisker Players, the chorus gained an added dimension.

The result was a delicate balance of voice and instrument, enhancing the final presentation.

The second half featured local boy soprano Alexander Fraser, as he soloed in the Chichester Psalms by Leonard Bernstein. The final portion of the show gave guest baritone Patrick Timney an opportunity to display his talent with his performance of the Five Mystical Songs, by R. Vaughan Williams.

This concert had an emotional side to it, as it was dedicated to the memory of longtime Choral Society member Doris Lindsay, who died last year.

To experience the sheer power and emotion of the music is an experience in itself. It's certainly not for all, but all should experience the atmosphere, emotion, and feel the power, at least once in their life.

They might be pleasantly surprised.
