ONTARIO PROVINCIAL ELECTION

You Can Vote Before June 3rd

If your name is on the Voters List but you expect to be away or unable to vote on election day, you can take advantage of any advance poll *in your electoral district*. Ballots cast at the advance polls will be counted at the close of the regular polls on election day.

Eligible voters who wish to vote at an advance poll, but who have not yet received their Notice of Registration confirming that they are on the Voters List, may obtain a Certificate to Vote from the revision assistant at the advance poll location prior to casting their ballot.
