Greenwood was selected for being the top AHS golfer in the first three tournaments.


Holmes was selected for her performance in the mixed doubles tennis play at the Halton quarterfinals, held at Cedar Springs Racquet Club in Burlington.

Rebels no-hit Redmen 10-0

The Georgetown District High School Rebels don't appear intent on surrendering their Halton softball title.

GDHS pitchers Jen Lucas and April Everingham stole the show in Tuesday's second-place showdown by tossing a six-inning no-hitter in a 10-0 victory. The Rebels and the Acton Redmen entered the game with identical 4-1 records but the Rebel pitching staff took command of the battle of Halton Hills teams.

Lucas retired nine of the 10 batters she faced, allowing only a second-inning walk to Shannon DaSilva. She also chalked up four strikeouts in her three innings of work before handing the ball over to Everingham in the fourth.

Everingham retired the side in order the fourth but ran into trouble in the fifth. She loaded the bases on consecutive walks but escaped the jam with two of her six strikeouts. Acton's Charla Banks was the biggest threat to the no-hitter, leading off the sixth with a solid hit to centre that was caught. Everingham then struck out the next two to wrap



things up.

"Our pitching is very strong," said Rebel coach Jim Hall. "I'd say it's the best in the (region)."

It could remain that way for quite some time, too. Lucas is in Grade 9, Everingham is in Grade 11 and Cheyl Mastalerz, the winning pitcher in last year's Halton final, is in Grade 10. The staff is rounded out by OAC student Jackie Brady.

Brady was making her contributions offensively against Acton. With the Rebels up 1-0 on Mastalerz's

RBI-single, Brady smacked a tworun single to left.

Nicole Graves singled home Andrea Diaczok in the second to make it 4-0 and Jen Cabral drove in the fifth GDHS run two innings later.

The Rebels put things away in the fifth with a five-run rally. First, Everingham singled home Melanie Southworth and Brady and Jodi Hutzal added two more with a double down the left-field line. Kerri Lindsay capped the rally with a base hit to score Hutzal.
