Lawn watering restrictions to be in effect from June to August

rea residents and businesses will only be able to water their lawns L on specific days in June, July and August under Halton Region's water conservation program.

The mandatory lawn watering restrictions, which are introduced annually, will be in place for the three summer months because during those months water use can increase by more than 50 per cent, and most of that water is used for lawns and gardens.

"The water tables are particularly low for this time of year so everyone needs to do their part in conserving our water," said Halton Region Planning and Public Works Department co-ordinator of customer service Lynn Johns.

An even/odd day system will be used to reduce peak water demands and the lawn watering program will be enforced by Planning and Public Works Department staff.

Properties with even-numbered addresses will water on the even calendar days, whereas properties with odd-numbered addresses will water on the odd calendar days. Townhouse units will water according to the unit number, not address number of the complex. Apartment buildings will also follow by the building number only.

The program includes all residential, commercial and industrial properties, golf courses and municipal properties, such as schools, parks and arena that use municipal water. It doesn't include car washing, hand watering by can, spray nozzles,

newly-placed sod and lawns treated with pesticides, herbicides or fertilizers.

Although a maximum fine of \$2,000 may be assessed for violators, the co-operation of all residents will ensure the success of the water conservation program. Water conservation will reduce the water being used by everyone, thus minimizing the strain on regional water systems and potentially reduce the cost to residents on their water and sewer bill.

The region reports that the average lawn watering for 30 minutes uses 360 gallons of water, which is the equivalent of an eight-person hot tub full of water.

The region estimates that if all the homes in Halton Hills watered on the same day approximately 4.7 gallons of water would be used, which is the equivalent of 267 16 ft. by 32 ft. swimming pools full of water.

Three bikes, valued at \$1,800, were stolen from an unlocked Miller Dr. garage between 12:30 a.m. and 4:45 a.m. Monday.


