As in the past, fair-goers can take in a variety of horse shows including the Halton 4-H Heavy Horse Club Achievement Day Friday at 7 p.m., on Saturday the Hunter Schooling Show at 9 a.m. and the Western Horse Point Award Show at 9:30 a.m and on Sunday the Heavy Horse Show at 10 a.m. and Light Horse Show and Pony Show at noon.


"We're expecting a good turnout and competition in the horse shows this year," said Calder.
