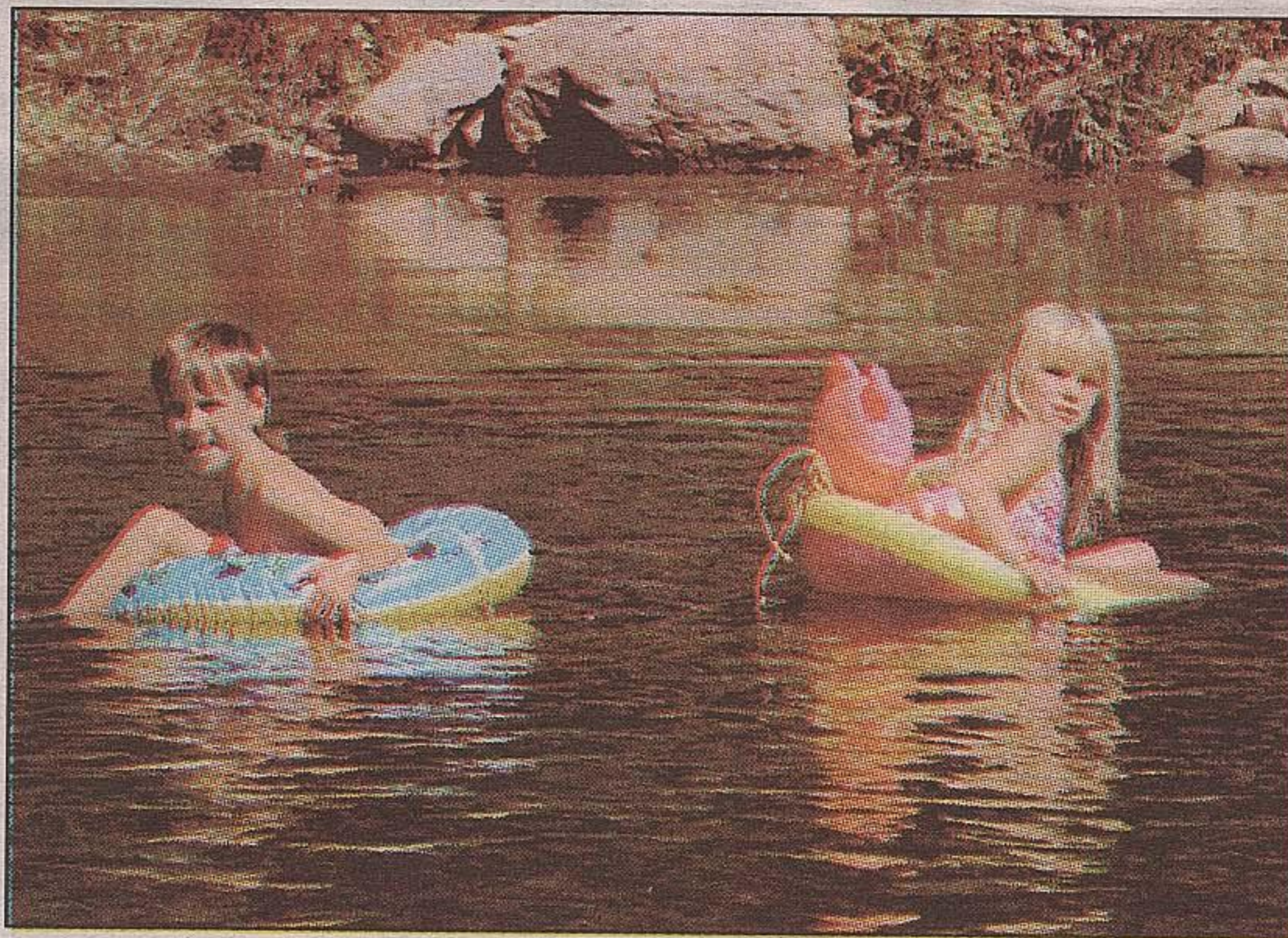

THE MISINFORMATION PROBLEM

Despite the widespread publicity that attended the efforts of Denturists to secure the passage of legislation that would allow us to deal directly with the public, many people in Ontario are still not aware of what a Denturist is or what services we provide.

Since 1970 and particularly since 1974, when the Ontario Legislature passed the "Denture Therapist Act, 1974" many Ontario citizens have directly availed themselves of the services provided by denturists.

Compounding the problem of public confusion is the fact that when the Provincial Government finally enacted legislation, they described the new dental health worker as a "denture therapist." While all members of the Denturist Association of Ontario are licensed "Denturist" we often use the name "Denture Therapist" because of its familiarity to the public. In addition, like other professions, advertising practices are restricted.

Although less-known than other professions, denturists have never the less provided an important health service to the people of Ontario. Not only does the denturist provide a full range of denture services directly to the patient, but he provides this service at a cost that makes wearing dentures possible for many who could not otherwise afford them. There are currently nine provinces and one territory in Canada where this service is possible. Besides Ontario, denturists in British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Newfoundland and the Yukon Territory also have the same right to serve the general public.
