

United Way sets target

The United Way of Halton Hills isn't waiting for the millennium to give itself a new look. The organization launched its 1999 campaign on Friday, announcing its goal of raising \$240,000 for its 19 member agencies.

The goal was unveiled at The President's Ball, the first of many changes in this year's drive. The event, attended by more than 80 people, replaces the luncheon that was held in past years.

"We found that even people on our own board who work out of the area weren't able to attend (during the day)," said executive director Brenda Smith. "That, and we just felt we needed a change."

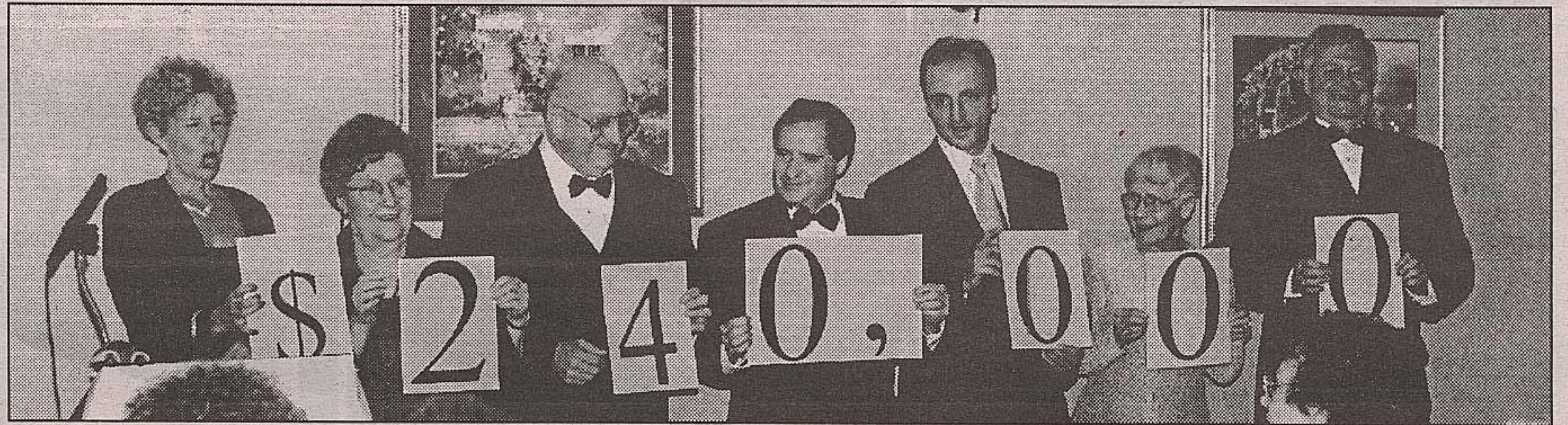
The other change which people will notice in the coming months is the United Way of Halton Hills will no longer conduct a door-to-door campaign. It will follow the lead of other United Way organizations by going to a direct mail campaign. Smith said the change was made for the safety of canvassers, to be less intrusive and because other areas have found it to be equally as effective in the long term.

Another new feature to the campaign is a draw for a 2000 Volkswagen Beetle GLS, donated by Autohaus Georgetown. There will be only 5,000 tickets sold for the car, valued at \$28,000. Tickets are \$20 and are available through all United Way agencies, the United Way office, Autohaus Georgetown and Halton Hills Credit Union. The draw will be held Jan. 15.


In her speech, United Way president Eunice McGowan addressed the difficulties facing the organization and its agencies.

"The community of Halton Hills, which has always prided itself in being a caring community, has also become a rapidly growing community," she said. "This growth, coupled with significant changes and reductions in funding from governments has severely challenged our local agencies and has dramatically increased the pressures on the United Way to raise funds to support the vital services they provide."

McGowan also pointed out that United Way services help one in every three citizens and that all money raised in the community stays in the community.

United Way of Halton Hills INFORMATION BULLETIN HALTON RECOVERY HOUSE

Established 1975, in a 130 year old farm house north of Milton, Halton Recovery House has evolved into a 21 man, three month residential treatment facility for substance abuse additions. It is located on a little over five acres of land on the east side of Trafalgar Rd. just north of Steeles Ave. in Hornby, Ont.

Halton Recovery House provides a spiritual program within a therapeutic community using cognitive and behavioural approaches. There is twelve months of aftercare and support for the men and their families as well as a graduate couples program.

The addiction problems are addressed by:

- challenging and guiding the men to recognize and accept reality.
- treating their inability to give and receive love with a shift in perspective and attitude (thinking, acting and feeling in terms of others rather than self)
- establishing a new model of living which moves the men from personal isolation to healthy relationships and purposeful roles in the community.

The long term goal is to enable the men and their families to develop loving interactions and responsible behaviour within families, relationships and communities, leading to spiritual growth beyond the need or desire to abuse substances.
