

The first Trans-Canada Cycling Tour passed through Halton Hills briefly Friday as 96 of the world's best cyclists zipped along Winston Churchill Blvd. through Norval during the eighth stage of the 10-stage tour. Riders began the eighth stage in Vaughan Friday morning and finished the day in Hamilton. The tour wound up Sunday in Fort Erie with the cyclists having covered 1,479 kilometres through 116 municipalities in Ontario and Quebec.
