

Thile thousands of Canadians attempting to post times that will qualify will take part in the Terry Fox Run on Sunday, a group of local runners will be setting off not too far from where the Marathon of Hope began.

Seven members of the Georgetown Runners will be participating in the Newfoundland Provincial Marathon in St. John's. The 40 members of the club are regulars at the local Terry Fox Runs but Doris Biron, Jim Clarke, Kristy Elmslie, Stephen Garland, Jon Lynne-Davies, Colin Royce Georgetown and Cheryl Strathcan of Norval will instead be taking part in the 42.6km marathon this year.




