
Open house/workshop Sept. 25

Guide to the Outdoors



This fall; get out and discover Escarpment Country in Halton! Ron Brown has written a book called ONTARIO'S SECRET LANDSCAPES or 50 more visits to unusual Ontario (\$19.95). Chapter 33 is called the Strange Story of Crawford Lake. In it he describes the Conservation Area as a rare find because of Crawford Lake which geologists call "meromictic" extremely deep resulting in many unusual lake effects. Lake Crawford is estimated to be 15,000 years old and among the layers of silt that cover the bottom, scientists have discovered evidence of pre-historic Huron habitation. Check it out! 
