Blue Fins trio get rare opportunity

Three members of the Halton Hills Blue Fins got to swim with one the biggest fish in Canadian swimming.

Chris Henderson, Scott Willson and Alex Main were among 23 swimmers who took part in the Curtis Myden High Performance Swim Camp in Calgary.

It was the first swim camp held by Myden, a double bronze medalist at the Atlanta Olympics and a two-time gold medalist at this summer's Pan Am Games in Winnipeg. It included four hours each day in the pool, focusing on enhancing their strokes, turns and overall conditioning. There were also seminars on nutrition, race strategies, positive thinking and dry land muscle training.

"It gave us an opportunity to train in elite

training facilities with elite coaches," Henderson said. "I also enjoyed talking to Curtis Myden about his personal experiences."

"Curtis was just a regular guy but when he showed us his Olympic medals I realized how much he had accomplished" said Alex Main, a two-time winner of the club's top swimmer award. "Working with Curtis really inspired me."

The local trio have won medals in local, divisional and provincial swim meets. They combined to help the club earn a bronze medal in the 15-and-over medley relay at the Ontario Division III Provincial Swim meet.

"He's a really fantastic athlete," said Willson. "He talked to us about motivation and stressed the importance of training."
