


# PLANNING NOW!

#### HOW ABOUT A CHRISTMAS PARTY AT DEERHURST RESORT



\$1.5M to go to reserve fund

## Town books show \$1.6M surplus

The Town of Halton Hills had a good financial year in 1998-L there is a \$1.6 million surplus.

Halton Hills council learned at a recent council meeting that the year end surplus for 1998 was \$1,642,242. According to council policy, \$100,000 will be allocated to the 1999 operating budget and the remaining amount, \$1.5 million, will go into the Capital Financing Reserve Fund to assist with future capital projects.

The town earned more money than anticipated in supplementary taxes (\$70,000 more), administration fees (\$320,016), building permits (\$171,350), development applications (\$59,000) and

other revenues for a total of \$748,311. Add to that, the town was under budget by \$893,931 on its expenditures.

The town spent \$123,249 on legal fees, \$201,801 on tax write-offs, and \$201,660 on Ontario Municipal Board (OMB) hearings. The town spent less than expected in the engineering and public works, fire department and recreation and cultural services departments.

The town has \$11 million set aside in its various reserve and trust funds, including almost \$5 million in its development charges fund. The interest rate paid on the reserve funds is based on the rate earned on the town's investments an average 4.71 per cent.

### Staff asked to get tough with weeds

Regional Councillor Rick Bonnette has requested staff come up with a enforcement policy on weed-filled lots in urban areas.

Bonnette said several lots in the Acton area, for example, have become havens for weeds, and a bylaw is needed to give some teeth behind a town phone call to lot owners to deal with the problem.

The current bylaw deals only with limited kinds of weeds, and the bylaw needs to be strengthened to include more weeds and to deal with absentee owners.


