Acton under-13 squad wins Toronto all-star tournament

The Acton Musicland Under-13 Girls doubled Brampton 2-1 to capture the championship at the Toronto Soccer Association All-Star Tournament.

Bella Wolfer got Acton rolling in the final, scoring her fourth goal of the tournament. Laura Pacevicius extended Acton's lead after finding the top corner from 25 metres out. Brampton pulled within a goal but the Acton defence, led by Beth Clayton, held off their opponents for the victory.

Acton advanced to the final by blanking Etobicoke Select 1-0 in the semis. Etobicoke was the only team to beat Acton in round-robin play. Wolfer had the game's only goal.

Acton opened the tournament by playing to a scoreless draw with Islington. They followed that up with a 3-0 victory over Etobicoke. Wolfer used her speed to cash in on a pair of break-

aways while Tia Hess added the third goal with a low shot just inside the post. Allison Clemmens recorded her second straight shutout.

Ava Stofast scored on a nice individual effort for Acton's only goal in a 3-1 loss to Etobicoke Select. A 1-1-1 record left Acton tied for first with Brampton in its division. Brampton earned first in a shootout that went to the sixth kick before being decided.

Mustangs Girls U-16

The Georgetown Mustangs Girls U-16 made it to the final of the John Henderson Memorial Tournament in London but the Windsor Nationals defeated them 3-1 to win the title.

The Mustangs opened the tournament against London United. Joanna McFatrige scored from 25 yards out to open the scoring but London earned a tie with a late goal.

The Mustangs then met the Nationals

and again jumped ahead, on a free kick by Michelle McFatrige, only to have Windsor even things up late.

Georgetown then blanked Windsor Teutonia 2-0 on goals by Lesley Mullins and Krista Nicholls and wrapped up the qualifying round by shutting out North London 2-0. Michelle McFatrige and Sinead Irvine scored for the Mustangs.

The final was the Mustangs' seventh game in six days and the Nationals, who Georgetown had tied earlier in the tournament, capitalized for the 3-1 win.

In Ontario Youth Soccer League play, the Mustangs continued their late season surge. Michelle McFatrige scored on a free kick from 30 yards out and Heather Stephens came up with a string of saves to preserve a 1-1 draw with Burlington. Two days later, strong performances by Melanie Sherren, Lisa Felice and midfielder Sabita Bachoo helped the Mustangs tie West Rouge 1-1.

The Hockey Trainers Certification Program will be held at Georgetown District High School tomorrow (Saturday) from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

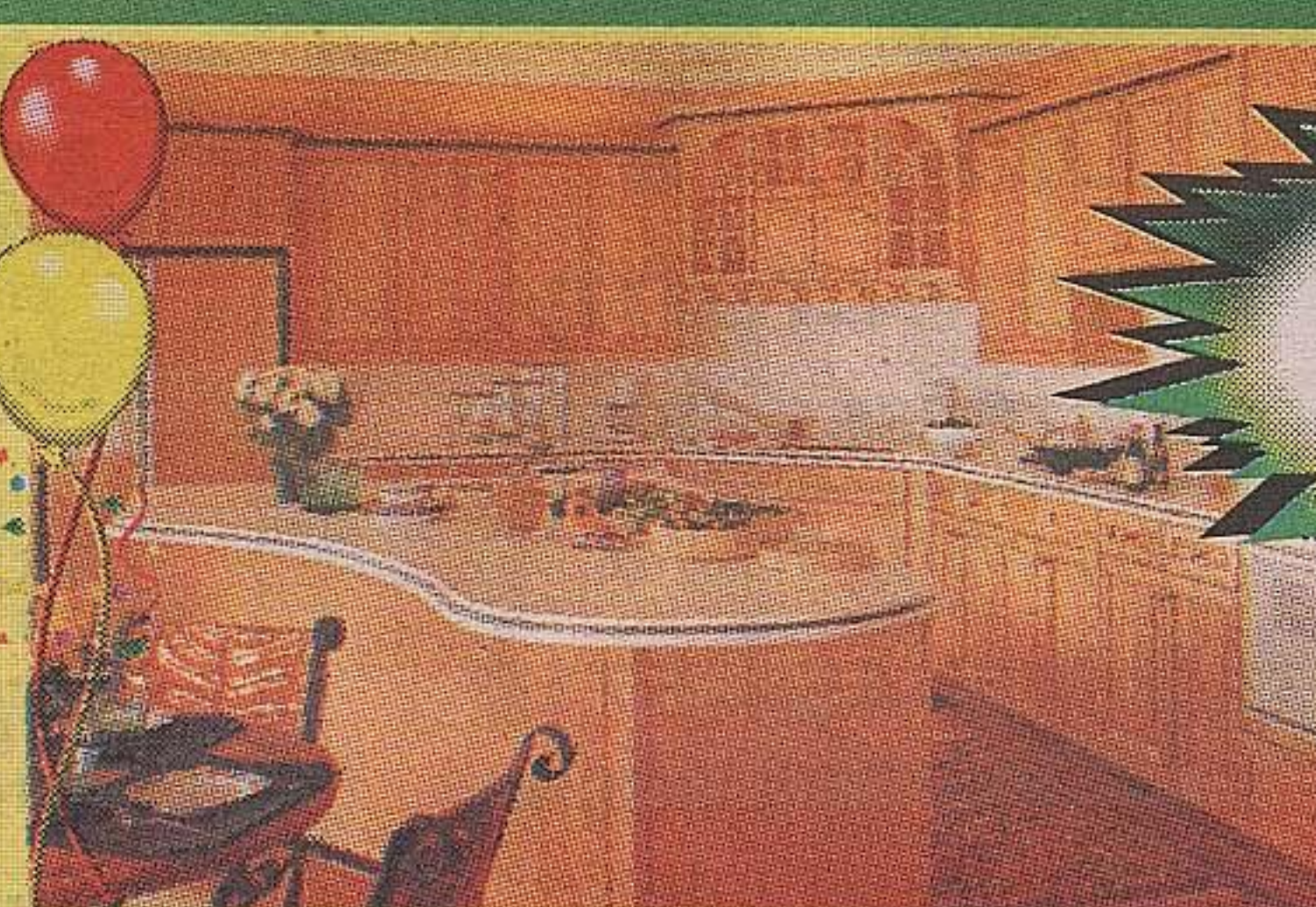

Each Ontario Minor Hockey Association team requires a certified trainer.

The cost for the course is \$50. Halton Hills volunteers will receive half of the registration back upon successful completion of the course.
