

Y2K? We're ready

An open letter to the public from Leo N. Steven, President and CEO of William Osler Health Centre

The staff at William Osler Health Centre have been diligently planning over the past year to be ready for Y2K. With January 1st, 2000 only mere weeks away, please be assured that we have taken detailed measures to address problems which may arise from Y2K related incidents and that we anticipate no disruption of hospital services to our respective communities.

What we have done

Our planning process has included a contingency staffing plan, materials and supplies backup, equipment compliance testing, emergency utility systems testing, and telecommunications systems upgrades. I am pleased to report that we have completed our inventory of date sensitive equipment. The last of the replacement equipment is being purchased and our computer and communications network upgrades are on schedule for completion on December 1, 1999. We are testing our systems and have prepared backup contingency plans in the unlikely event of a Y2K related failure.

As we saw in the ice storm disaster in Montreal in 1998, hospitals typically become a refuge when disaster strikes. While we have some measure of control over our internal planning for Y2K, we have been working with other community service providers to assist them in their contingency planning.

We are here, it is business as usual now and beyond 2000 to meet your health care needs. You have my word on it.
