Redmen win consol title

The Acton Redmen got a boost heading into the stretch drive of the junior girls basketball season.

Acton built an early lead and rolled to a 48-25 victory over the Milton District Mustangs to claim the consolation title at the Acton Invitational Junior Girls Basketball Tournament on Saturday.

"We had good pressure on the ball and we forced more turnovers," said Acton coach Caley French. "We had smarter passing, good defence and a lot of hustle."

Meghann Williams keyed the Acton offence with numerous steals to set up the fast break and excellent outside shooting. Megan McIntyre turned in her best games of the season in the consolation final and in a 25-19 semifinal win over Georgetown.

While the offence struggled in the win over Georgetown, Acton's defence came through with a strong performance to advance to the final.

Acton opened the tournament with a 37-26 loss to Pearson.

"We started out fairly slow and they went on a big run at the start," French said. "After that we played with them."

It was a marked improvement

over Pearson's 52-26 win two days earlier in league play. Holly Goddard scored 11 points and was Acton's top rebounder. The tournament result showed Acton can com-

pete with the top teams.

Acton followed up the tournament triumph with a 33-29 victory over M.M. Robinson on Tuesday, to improve to 5-2 on the season.

Rebel ready to run

Chris Henderson wishes he had more of an uphill battle ahead of him. The Grade 10 runner from Georgetown District High School captured both the Halton and Golden Horseshoe Athletic Conference (GHAC) titles on the hilly Kelso Conservation Area course. Now he'll lead the Rebels into the Ontario Federation of Schools Athletic Association (OFSAA) race Saturday in Etobicoke.

"It's a pretty flat course," he said. "I think the hills are to my advantage but we'll have to see what happens there."

Henderson played follow the leader through much of the race, which served as both the Halton and GHAC championship. Then on the final hill, he took the lead and pulled away for a 21 second victory in a time of 20 minutes, 14 seconds.

Henderson's performance along with three other top-20 finishes helped the Rebels junior boys team finish second and qualify for OFSAA. Joining Henderson will Tim Mansfield (10th in Halton, 11th in GHAC), Donovan Olinoski (17th in Halton, 19th in GHAC) and Scott Rostrup (18th in Halton, 20th in GHAC).

The junior girls team won the Halton championship and were second in GHAC, earning them a trip to OFSAA as well. Jenny Adams paced the team by finishing fourth in Halton, fifth in GHAC with a time of 19:09. Making up the rest of the team are Tonya Butler (12th Halton, 16th GHAC), Arden MacLean (17th Halton, 21st GHAC) and Arla Latto-Hall (24th Halton, 29th GHAC).

Robbie Adams has also qualified in the senior boys race by placing fifth in Halton and seventh in GHAC with a time of 26:42.

Other top-20 finishes were turned in by Katie White (ninth in Halton and GHAC) and Sheena Butler (15th in Halton, 17th in GHAC) in the senior girls race; Devon MacLean (ninth in Halton, 12th in GHAC) in the midget girls race and Matt Holtom (19th in the Halton, 25th in GHAC) in the midget boys race.

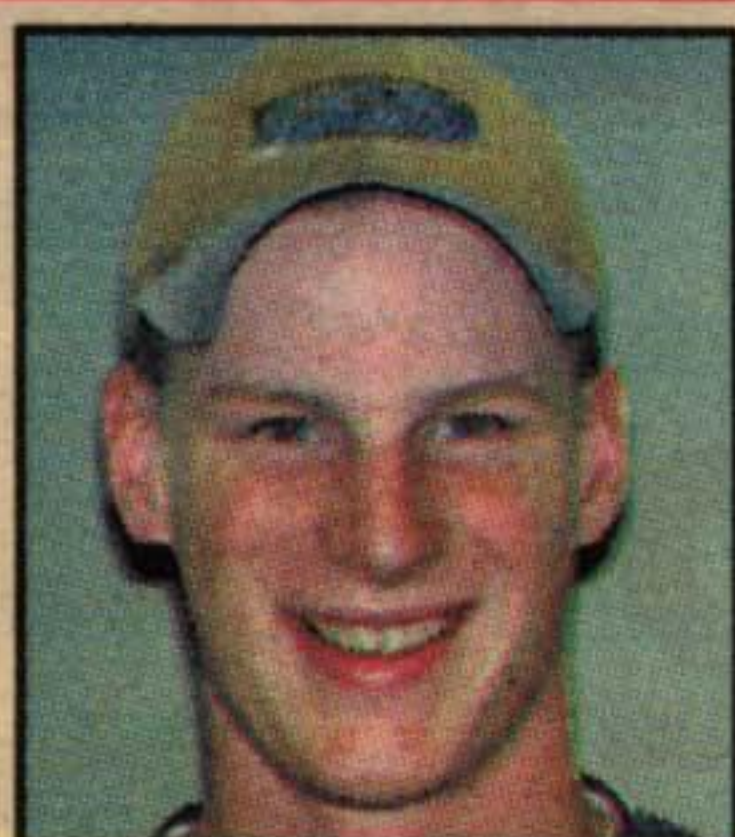
