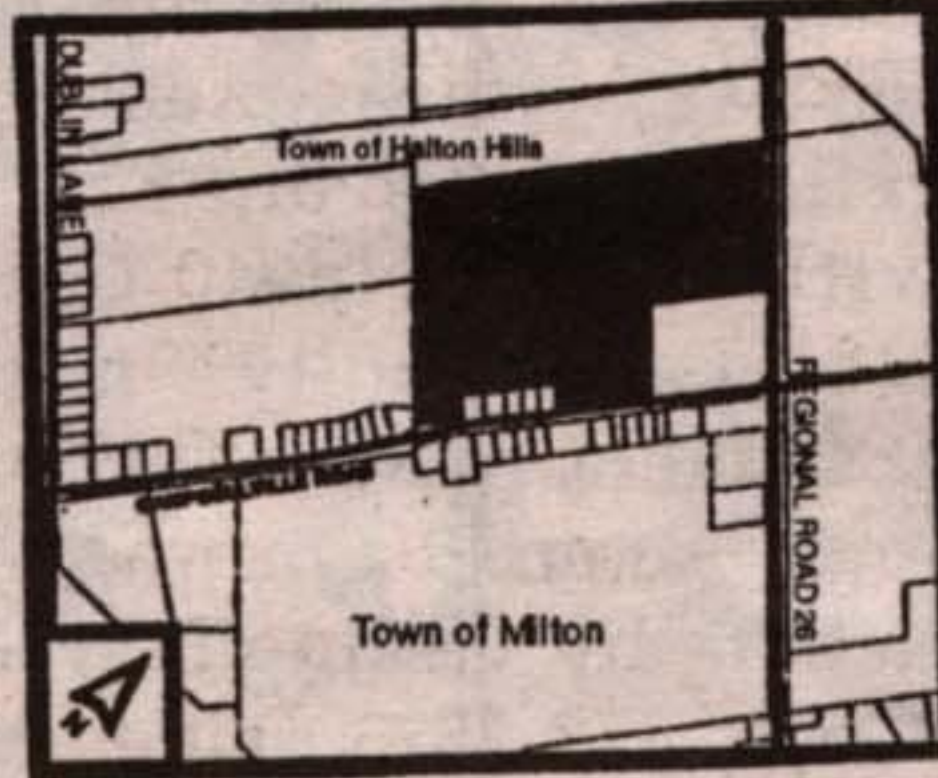
REGION OF HALTON NOTICE OF A PUBLIC MEETING Proposed Amendment No. 10 To the Official Plan for the Region of Halton

The Council of the Regional Municipality of Halton, through its Planning and Public Works Committee, is holding a Public Meeting to provide interested individuals an opportunity to comment on proposed Halton Region Official Plan Amendment No. 10

To Get More Information: Proposed Amendment No. 10 may be viewed at the Office of the Regional Clerk, between 8:30 A.M. and 4:30 P.M. weekdays, or a copy may be obtained by calling Susan O'Brien, at Extension 7180 at one of the numbers below. Those wishing to address the Committee are requested to telephone the Regional Clerk, Joan Eaglesham, at Extension 7237, prior to Wednesday, November 24, 1999, 4:30 P.M.

Purpose of the Amendment: The purpose is to permit a day use program for developmentally delayed adults and a golf driving range. The site, is approximately 27.2 ha and located on the east side of Regional Road No. 25 and north of Regional Road No. 9 (Campbellville Road). The property is legally described as Part of East Half of Lot 6 Concession II (Township of Esquesing), in the Town of Halton Hills.

Notes: If you wish to be notified of the adoption of the proposed Official Plan Amendment, you must make a written request to the Regional Clerk at the address noted above. If a person files a notice of appeal of decision of the Regional Municipality of Halton in respect of the proposed Official Plan Amendment and does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submission to the Regional Municipality of Halton before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted, the Ontario Municipal Board may dismiss all or part of the appeal.
