

The jolly old man himself, Santa Claus, will arrive in Georgetown tomorrow (Saturday) for the annual Georgetown Lions Club Santa Claus parade. There will be approximately 70 entries in this year's event.

anta Claus is coming to town a little later this year but there's no doubt his young admirers think it's worth the wait.

The annual Georgetown Lions Club Santa Claus parade will make its way through town this Saturday beginning at 1:30 p.m. The parade is being held a week later than usual. Organizer John Holland said the change was made so that it would not conflict with Remembrance Day ceremonies and to accommodate bands that wanted to participate.

The approximately 70 entries will start from Sinclair Ave, making their way down Guelph St. to Mill St., where they will turn left. The parade will follow Mill St. to Charles St., where it will again turn left and follow Charles to the Georgetown Fairgrounds. It should take the parade an hour to 90 minutes to pass a point along the route.

Seven bands will be taking part, including the Acton Citizens' Band, the Oakville Shriners, the Guelph Sea Cadets, the Arthur District High School Band, the Georgetown Pipe Band, the Georgetown Air Cadets and the Black Forest Air Cadets.

Organizers have asked that the crowds stay back to give the parade room to go by. There will be no parking on Mill St. between 1-4 p.m.
