

# Four new Halton Police recruits to be assigned to Halton Hills

Four of Halton Regional Police Service's newest recruits will be assigned to Halton Hills.

The new officers were sworn in at a ceremony in the regional council chambers in Oakville Friday.

Newly assigned to Halton Hills are constables Paul Craig, Paul DaRosa, Colin Grierson and Terrance Hawkins.

Craig was raised on a dairy farm in Kinburn, Ontario and in 1995 graduated from the law and security administration program at Algonquin College. He volunteered with the Ottawa-Carlton community policing program and the HOPE volleyball project.

Prior to joining Halton Police Craig was a cadet with the Ontario Provincial Police.

DaRosa was raised in Peel Region and graduated from the Law and Security program at Sheridan College in 1993.

Prior to joining Halton DaRosa worked as an armored car guard and as a correctional worker. He is an active volunteer with Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD), Salvation Army Family Services and Block Parents.

Grierson was raised in Montreal and South Africa. He attended high school and college in Montreal and more recently obtained a degree in sociology and political science from the University of Western Ontario.

Grierson spent three years in the Canadian Armed Forces as a member of the Royal Canadian Regiment, worked at the Infantry Battle School, was on the precision drill team and was posted to CFB London.

After leaving the service Grierson traveled throughout Australia, New Zealand, Singapore, South Africa and England.

Prior to joining Halton Police Grierson worked as a security officer at Labatt's.

Hawkins grew up in the rural area outside of St. Mary's, Ontario and lived on a dairy farm for most of his life.

He has a degree in psychology and sociology from Laurentian University in Sudbury and graduated from the paramedic program at Humber College in 1998.

Prior to joining Halton Police Hawkins was a member of the Canadian Coast Guard Search and Rescue Unit for the central and Arctic region for five seasons. He is a member of the Canadian Armed Forces Reserve.
