The councils for the Region of Halton and the Town of Halton Hills have supported pilot community safety zones on our roads. Fines will be higher for moving violations, and the level of enforcement will be accelerated.

Locations of special concern for public safety are in Georgetown: Maple Avenue between Trafalgar Rd. and Guelph St.; Mountainview Rd. between Eden Place and Campbell Gate; Delrex Blvd., from Sargent Rd. to Mountainview Rd. S., and in Acton: Mill St. W., from Victoria St. to Duby Rd. In some locations the signs are already in place. I again emphasize that community safety is the prime motivator for this traffic management program.

Keeping the memory alive— The Halton Hills community embraced the last Remembrance Day of the century. The gathering at Remembrance Park in Georgetown on Thursday was particularly poignant and moving. The Royal Canadian Legion Branch 120, citizens and the students from Park School


