## Public high school students want own region-wide council

epresentatives from Halton's public high schools may soon put their heads together to share ideas in a district-wide student council.

The two Halton District School Board student trustees, Georgia Simms and Mike McVety, recommended at last week's board meeting that a Halton District Student Council (HDSC) be formed.

The council would allow the student trustees to communicate directly with representatives of high school councils.

It would consist of one representative appointed by each Halton public high schools' student council. They would meet issues, share views and give feedback to the student trustees.

All meetings would be co-chaired by student trustees and attended by the board chair and director of education or their designates. The meetings would take place three times during the school year (fall, winter, spring) and locations would be rotated to ensure all areas can host the HDSC.

The purpose of the meetings would be to share ideas and information regarding activities of the board.

"This would make students feel connected to the board," said Simms. "This council

Halton. We are so spread out we need something to connect everyone. Representatives could share successful fund-raisers or activities and find out what works."

The student trustee position is quite new itself, with the first trustee installed last year. A second trustee was added to the board this year.

The student trustees cannot attend incamera sessions or vote but, otherwise, they have the same opportunities to participate as a regular board member.

They are appointed to represent the views of students within the Halton public school system.




