Rebels top Redmen for title, both look ahead to OFSAA

School Rebels may have defeated the Acton High School Redmen for Halton bragging rights but both teams have their attention squarely

focused on a bigger goal.

The Rebels won Tuesday's Halton Secondary School Athletic Association senior boys volleyball final 25-23, 25-11 but for them, the victory was just a stepping stone. They played yesterday (Thursday) for the right to advance to the Ontario Federation of Schools Athletic Association (OFSAA) AAA championship. Meanwhile, Acton already secured its spot in the OFSAA A tournament by beating Brampton Christian Academy three games to one on Wednesday.

Acton finished the season 8-1, second only to the undefeated Rebels. But the Redmen showed they were not content to settle for runner-up status. They stormed out of the gate, taking a 17-11 in the opening game. However, Georgetown managed to turn the game around, chipping away at the lead and eventually winning by two.

"We started a little slow. We knew they were good but they still surprised us," said Georgetown's Taylor Hall. "We missed a few hits but we pulled together and never really panicked."

Georgetown carried the momentum into the second game and came up with a 25-11 victory to clinch the title. Rebel middle Jon Dubyk said their league game against Acton helped them in the final.

"We knew a little bit more about them this time," he said. "We tried to keep it away from the inside more than we did before."

As the Rebels prepared for the Golden Horseshoe Athletic Conference (GHAC) title game against Hamilton's St. Thomas Moore, they were confident but knew they had to come out stronger.

"We've been working up to this year for a long time," said Hall. "We just have to play our game. We've got a couple players that we didn't have before. We can only lose to ourselves."

Although Acton came away without the victory, they did earn a lot of respect.

"I was very impressed. They were very well prepared," said Rebel coach Jonas Kaciulis. "They should have a really good shot at a medal at OFSAA."

Acton ensured it would be at OFSAA by winning Wednesday's qualifier. This time it was Acton that started slowly. Brampton Christian Academy won the opening game. Acton evened the match by taking the second game but then fell behind 19-12 in the pivotal third game.

The determined Redmen squad Georgetow fought back, though, and ended up win- against us." ning a thriller 28-26.




