at the hospital, which is not funded by the Ministry of Health.


Items required include a surveillance unit for intensive care, patient lifts and slings, maternity bassinet, ECG monitors for Emergency, stretchers, and laprascopic surgical equipment.

'The most important donors to us are the donors that donate every year," said Fraser.

He stressed that all of the money donated to Georgetown Hospital stays at Georgetown Hospital and isn't spent at the other campuses of the William Osler Health Centre.
