Seeds signs with University of Findlay

With his future secure, Jeff Seeds is looking to pour all his energy into the present.

The 20-year-old Georgetown Raider winger has accepted a scholarship from the University of Findlay for next season and would like nothing more than to cap his Jr. A career with a championship.

"We have a championship calibre team," he said. "I'm looking forward to the challenge of bringing a championship to Georgetown."

Seeds was also being recruited by Michigan Tech but chose Findlay because of its location and because of the bigger role he'll play.

"Jeff has a terrific blend of

skill and competitiveness. He can make plays and score goals. We believe Jeff will make an immediate impact on our hockey club," said Findlay head coach Craig Barnett in a release announcing the signing.

Seeds knows very well how an expanded role can elevate his game. He averaged a point a game while utilized as a third or fourth-line player with Milton. After being acquired by the Raiders he was immediately inserted on the top line and finished the season with 81 points in 48 games.

He's continued that this season, with 19 goals and 46 points in 22 games, earning him a share of the West Conference lead in points with linemate Stage Page.

"The Georgetown Raider organization gave play in this league and compete at this level," Seeds said. "Everyone here has been great."

The Ohio university is in its first year of NCAA Division I competition, a member of the newly formed College Hockey America conference. It will unveil a new 4,500-seat arena next year.
