Council delays hydro decision for public input

I alton Hills council has postponed a decision to take over the hydro business in town until the public has a chance to have their say.

Council decided, at last week's meeting, to hold two public meetings— one each in Georgetown and Acton— to gauge public opinion on a plan to operate Halton Hills Hydro as part of a town-owned company.

Dates for the meetings are: Tuesday, Dec. 7, 7 p.m. at the Civic Centre and Wednesday, Dec. 8, 7 p.m. at Halton Hills Hydro, 43 Alice St., Acton.

Last year, the Ontario government passed the Energy Competition Act which in effect deregulates the hydro industry and introduces competition— starting in 2000. Hydro customers will have a choice of who will supply their electricity, much like the telephone and natural gas industries.

The wires and the towers that carry the

electricity from generating staions to municipal electric utilities like Halton Hills Hydro, will be maintained by the Ontario Hydro Services Company,

With deregulation there's about a \$21 increase on hydro bills.

regulated by the Ontario Energy Board.

But the distribution and retailing of such things as electricity, fibre optics and water heater rentals is now open to competition and it means the dismantling of Halton Hills Hydro in its current form.

Members of town staff, council and

Halton Hills Hydro board and staff formed a steering committee earlier this year to determine the direction this town should take.

It recommended unanimously to council that the town should operate the regulated utility called Halton Hills Hydro Inc. which will distribute electricity within the town and be the "default" supplier—the one who supplies hydro to a customer who doesn't choose a new supplier.

That company in turn would operate three companies: Halton Hills Fibre Optics to market that burgeoning technology; Halton Hills Energy Services Inc. to perform services such as street lighting, design and maintenance, water heater rentals, water billing services, etc; and Halton Hills Energy Inc. which will remain dormant inititally but has been set up to allow possible future entry into the marketing of energy.


