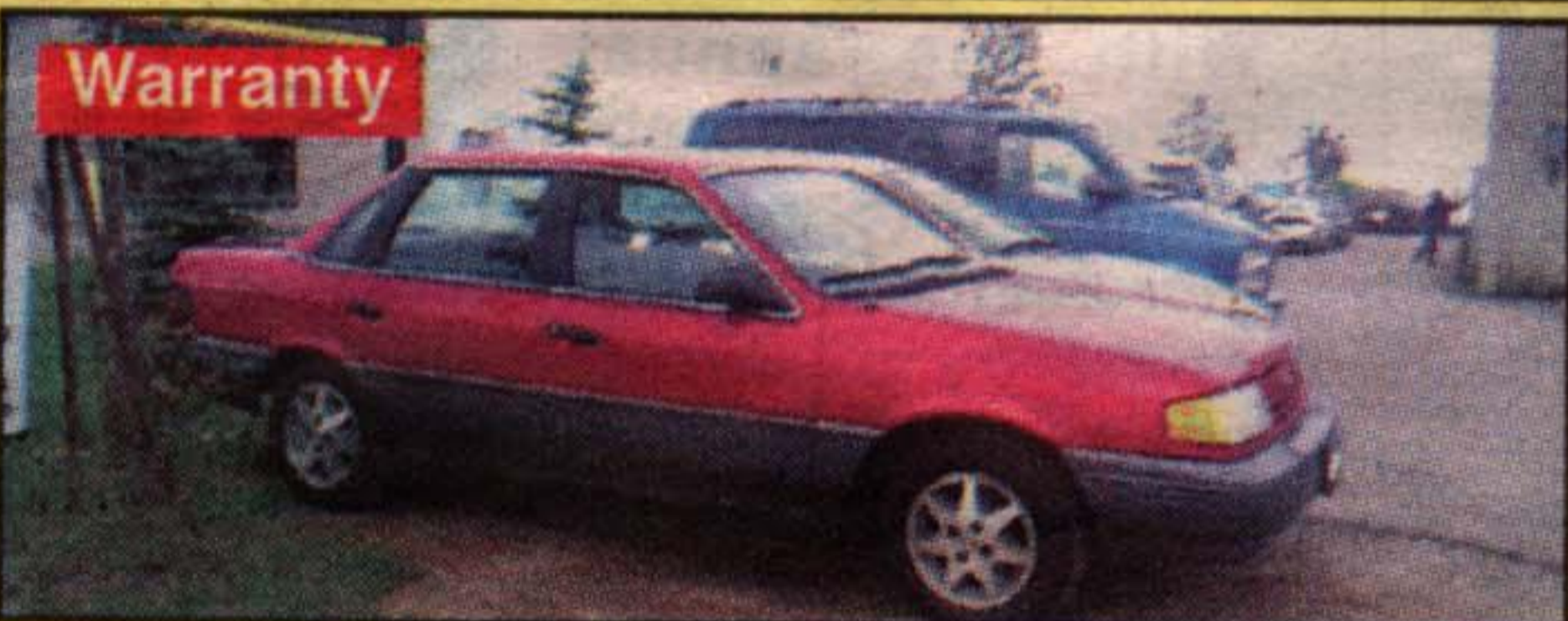

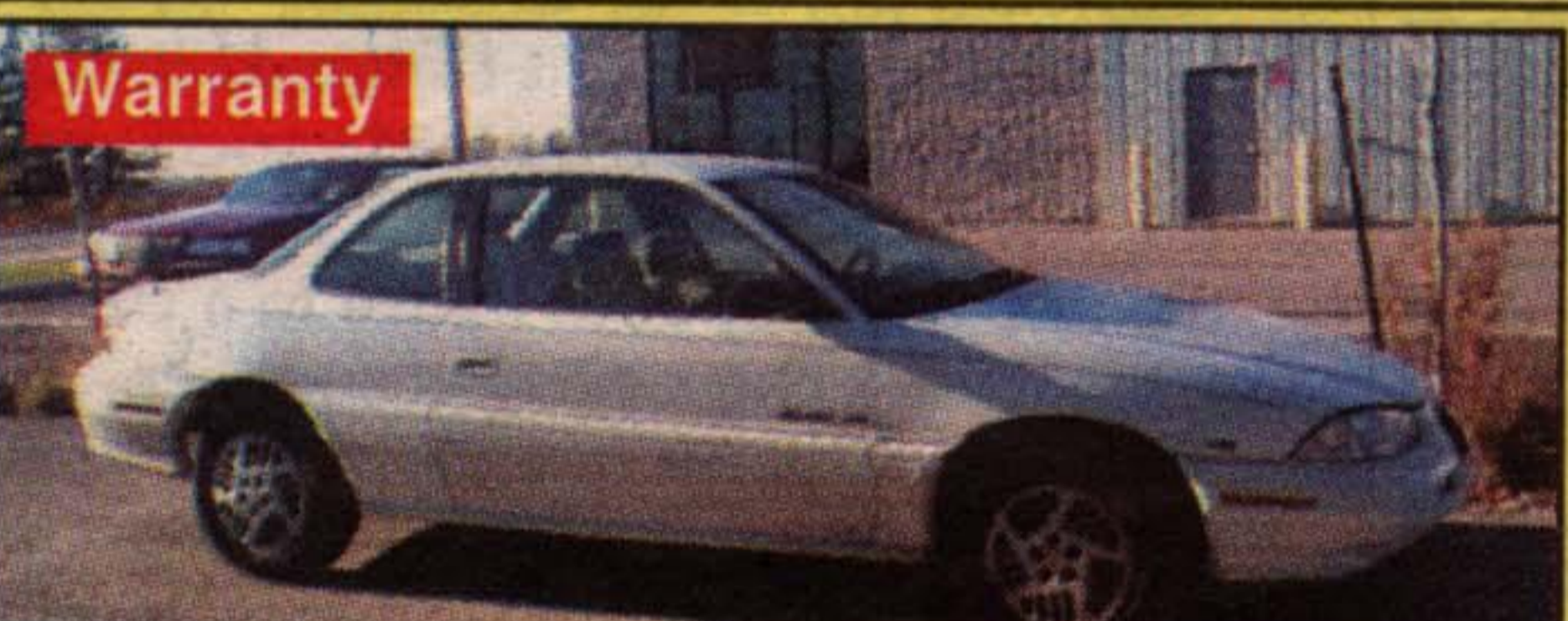

Woman sentenced for welfare fraud

A former Halton Hills woman pleaded guilty to defrauding the Region of Halton of \$10,022 in welfare assistance in Milton court Tuesday.

Terry Lynn Blanchard, 33, formerly of 15 Sideroad in Halton Hills, pleaded guilty to defrauding the region of welfare assistance between October 1, 1994 and August 20, 1995. She was charged by Halton Regional Police with fraud over \$5,000 in January 1996.

In court Blanchard admitted she had lived with her spouse and father of her child on 15 Sideroad in Milton while collecting welfare as a sole support parent from October 1994 through August 20, 1995.

Her lawyer, Raymond Li, told the court that a contributing factor in the fraud was that Blanchard feared her common-law spouse who had a history of violence and weapons.

Assistant Crown Attorney Leo McGuigan told the court that Blanchard had five previous fraud under \$5,000 convictions and one fail to appear in court conviction.

Blanchard was sentenced to one year in jail to be served as a conditional sentence and three years probation. A term of the probation order is that she is not to apply for welfare assistance while living with her spouse or any other adult during the conditional sentence and probation period.

She was also ordered to pay \$10,022 in restitution.

IGA arsonists sentenced

Two local men, who were charged with arson causing bodily harm in connection with the January 10 fire that gutted Halton Hills IGA and injured a firefighter, were recently sentenced in Milton court.

James Rommelaere, 20, of Guelph St. who pleaded guilty to the charge in August, was sentenced to 15 months in jail in addition to the seven months he has already served, and three years probation.

An 18-year-old Georgetown man, who was a young offender at the time of the incident, pleaded guilty and was sentenced to two months secure custody, two months open custody and two years probation.

Timothy Calver, 20, of Stewarttown Rd. has pleaded not guilty to the charge and his trial date has been set for April 11 in Milton.
