
Park principal Wendy Harrison said the writing con-

Aunt Maud's recipes off to Japan


unt Maud's Recipe Book will be translated into Japanese by 2001.


Norval authors Elaine and Kelly Crawford have reached an agreement with a Japanese firm to publish their book in the Japanese language, as a direct and literal translation of the original.

Drawings may be added to illustrate the Canadian style of food preparation, which could be foreign to traditional Japanese cuisine.


