Cat owner shocked to find timid pet shot in the eye

A cat in Acton had to have an eye removed after it was shot with an air rifle.

Sarah Rosenmeier said she was shocked when she returned to her grandmother's Dairy Dr. Acton home last Sunday night and found her cat Blackie's eye hanging out.

She took the cat to the Acton Veterinary Clinic Monday morning and learned Tuesday veterinarian Dr. Stephen Hess had retrieved a pellet from her cat's eye. "The eye was shattered," said Hess.
"The lens had been torn out of the eye."

"I was in shock," said Rosenmeier, 18.
"I thought, my God, who would do something like this." She said the cat is very timid and generally stays around her grandmother's house.

She reported the shooting to both Halton Police and the Humane Society.

The cat, who went home from the clinic Wednesday, is doing fine and Hess said

she's expected to make a full recovery.

Hess said animals who have been shot are often brought to his clinic.

"It's not rare."

leachers' union officials are leaving the decision to participate in extracurricular activities in the hands of the teachers.

"What (teachers) in Halton have been instructed to do is make an individual decision based on their workload," said Larry Chud, president of the Ontario

Secondary School Teachers' Federation District 20 (Halton).

However, Chud said, judging by concerns raised at a meeting Wednesday night, he can see fewer teachers volunteering for extracurriculars.

"You can't keep cutting teachers and adding on time and expect it to be busi-

ness as usual," he said. "6.67 (hours of teaching time per day) is a significant workload and if you do that something has to give."

Dave Boycott, head of physical education at Acton High School, said the school's staff is meeting Monday night


