## Four incumbents file nominations for Nov. election

Four incumbent councillors recently filed their nomination papers and plan to vie again for their positions in the November municipal election.

Ward 3/4 regional councillor John Day filed his papers yesterday (Thursday), Ward 1 councillor Clark Somerville filed Wednesday and Ward 3 councillors Moya Johnson and Jane Fogal filed last Friday.

"I like working with and for the community," said Day who is seeking a third council term. If elected, he plans to continue his focus on youth, seniors, housing, renewal of downtown Georgetown, Remembrance Park and the Police Services Board along with the Trafalgar Sports Park, a Georgetown youth centre and public transportation for seniors and youth to access health and social services in the south.

"I feel I still have a lot to contribute," said Somerville. "I've worked hard over the last three years. The growth in Acton is right around the corner and I want to be there for that."

"Overall it (her term on council) has been a positive experience," said Fogal who is seeking a second term. "I'm pleased with the progress on the recreation facilities and the Hwy. 401 corridor, but there is more to do."

Johnson hopes to come back for a third term. "I would like to continue to represent the citizens of Ward 3," said Johnson. "I think I'm doing a good job and I like what I do."

She added she'd like to see the town's recreation facilities completed.

Johnson said while the town faces development pressures she is cognizant of the fact many residents want to retain Halton Hills small town atmosphere.

Other candidates who declared earlier are Mayor Marilyn Serjeantson and Kathy Gastle (mayor), Stephen Grasby (Ward 1 local), Ted Thompson (Ward 2 local), and Ron Chatten (Ward 4 local).
