### Thieves selective in taking credit cards

## Police say Toronto bandits targeting vehicles in Halton Region

Halton Regional Police report there is an organized group from Toronto that has been targeting vehicles parked at golf courses, playgrounds, soccer fields, etc.

What is unusual about this group is that they don't smash the windows when they enter the vehicle, often in the middle of the day. One car owner had the door to his vehicle drilled but didn't notice until it was later pointed out by police.

Once inside the vehicle, the bandits go into the victim's purse or wallet and they remove one or two credit cards and occasionally the driver's licence. Other cards are moved around to hide the gap left by the missing cards.

The wallet or purse is left in the exact same position so no one notices that anything is different. This buys the suspects time so they make purchases up to the maximum limit on the card before anyone notices it has been taken.

The cards have been used at local businesses to purchase computer equipment, cell telephones, and telephone cards.

There have been six of these thefts in the Oakville area in the last few weeks.

Residents are reminded not to leave their wallet/purse in their vehicle. This includes locations such as health clubs, sports fields, golf courses, malls, movie theatres, and also overnight in their driveway.
