NOTICE OF A PUBLIC MEETING Ward 2 / Concession 8, West Half of Lot 22 Dhir Ramesh, Henderson's Corners

General Committee for the Town of Halton Hills will conduct a Public Meeting to examine and discuss proposed amendments to the Official Plan and Zoning By-Law 74-51, as amended. The applications relate to a parcel of land, approximately 0.53 hectare in size, identified as 13515 Highway 7, Concession 8, West Half of Lot 22. The property includes an existing building, and is bounded by Regional Road 8 (Steeles Avenue) to the south, and agricultural lands to the east, north and west.

The proposed Official Plan Amendment would maintain the designation of "Rural Cluster Area", however it would recognize the existing 390 square metre commercial building on the subject lands, where the designation permits a commercial building up to 92 square metres.

The proposed Zoning By-law Amendment would change the zoning on the property from the "Rural RU Zone" to "Holding General Commercial H-C1 Zone".


If you wish to be notified of the adoption of the proposed Official Plan Amendment and/or the Zoning By-Law Amendment and/or the decision of the Town of Halton Hills in respect of these applications, you must make a written request to the Town of Halton Hills at 1 Halton Hills Drive, P.O. Box 128, Georgetown, Ontario L7G 5G2.

If a person or public body that files a notice of appeal of a decision of the Town of Halton Hills in respect of the proposed Official Plan Amendment does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Town of Halton Hills before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted, the Ontario Municipal Board may dismiss all or part of the appeal.

If a person or public body that files an appeal of a decision of the Town of Halton Hills in respect of the proposed Zoning By-Law does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Town of Halton Hills before the proposed zoning By-Law is adopted, the Ontario Municipal Board may dismiss all or part of the appeal.

Bonnette, Inglis the latest to announce

Two more incumbents will run

Two more veteran councillors have decided to run in the upcoming municipal election.

Rick Bonnette, who has been a regional councillor since 1985, and served as a local councillor for three years before that, is seeking his current Wards 1/2 regional council seat. Bob Inglis, who has one term on council behind him, hopes to regain his Ward 4 local council position in the November 13 election.

"I enjoy my job," said Inglis, who filed his nomination papers last week. "I'd like to see the recreational facilities through to the end."

"There's going to be a lot of important challenges and changes ahead," said Bonnette, who also filed last week.

He said he wants to see the Official Plan review, which he believes affects Ward 2 more than other wards, completed and some industrial growth in town.

"Residential and community growth in Acton, we're just around the corner from seeing that fulfilled."

Other incumbents who have declared to date are: Mayor Marilyn Serjeantson, Wards 3/4 Regional Councillor John Day, Ward 1 Councillor Clark Somerville, Ward 3 Councillors Moya Johnson and Jane Fogal and Ward 4 (local) Councillor Ron Chatten.

Ward 2 Councillor Kevin Kuiack is the lone incumbent yet to declare.

Challenging for seats on council are current Ward 2 Councillor Kathy Gastle who is seeking the mayor's chair, Ted Thompson who is vying for the Ward 2 seat and Stephen Grasby who is challenging for a Ward 1 position.

Ambulance hirings put on hold

dditional hiring for Halton's new inhouse ambulance service has been L put on hold for a while.

It has been put on ice while the region waits for the province to come to the table with its funding contribution, said Halton's Director of Ambulance Services Jim King.

"We've held the hiring off a bit," he told the region's Health and Social Services committee last week.

But equipment enhancements are being added on schedule, with many expected to be in place by Thanksgiving, he added.

Halton Region took over the operation of ambulance services from the province August 15. When it did, it brought with it a host of improvements, including more equipment and double the prior number of Advanced Care Paramedics (ACP).

ACPs are more highly trained than Primary Care Paramedics.

"We're the only region in Ontario that has an ACP on every ambulance," said Halton's Medical Officer of Health Dr. Bob Nosal.

Prior to the transfer, Halton Hills and Milton had no ACPs.

Also, new defibrillators— the paddles used to treat patients suffering a cardiac arrest are expected to be on board by December.

Four new ambulances are also slated for service, possibly as early as October.

In downloading ambulance operations, the province promised to kick in with a 50-50 funding split.

But that may have changed, said King. "It's going to be a grant," he said. "I don't

think they're calling it 50-50 now."

Though word could come as early as next month, King said the region expects to know what amount the province plans to pitch in by January.

NOTICE OF THE PASSING

OF ZONING BY-LAWS BY

THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF MISSISSAUGA

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Mississauga passed By-laws 0444-2000, 0445-2000 and 0446-2000 on the 13th day of September, 2000, under Section 34 of the Planning Act R.S.O., 1990, c.P.13, as amended.

AND TAKE NOTICE that any person or agency may appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board in respect of the Bylaws by filing with the Clerk of the City of Mississauga not later than the 10th day of October, 2000, a notice of appeal setting out the objection to the By-law and the reasons in support of the objection, together with a cheque in the amount of \$125.00 payable to the Minister of Finance for each of the By-laws.

Only individuals, corporations and public bodies may appeal a Zoning By-law to the Ontario Municipal Board. A notice of appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a notice of appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or group on its behalf.

Explanation of the purpose and effect of the by-laws:

By-law 0444-2000 to amend Zoning By-law 5500 (former Town of Mississauga), By-law 0445-2000 to amend Zoning By-law 65-30 (former Town of Streetsville) and By-law 0446-2000 to amend Zoning By-law 1227 (former Town of Port Credit) by:

adding night clubs as a permitted use in

Industrial zones;

deleting the existing provisions requiring night clubs to be a minimum separation distance of 800 m (2,625 ft.) from an Agriculture zone;

adding a provision requiring a night club to front on a major road;

· adding a provision requiring a night club to be a minimum separation distance of 800 m (2,625 ft.) from another night club building.
