Select Eagles end season on winning note

The Georgetown Eagles Boys Under-8 Select team ended their season in L championship form recently by winning the Scarborough Millennium All-Star Tournament.

In capturing the championship, the Eagles were the only undefeated team in the two-day, 10-team tournament, outscoring their opposition by a 16-4 margin.

Combining solid defence with timely goals and stellar goaltending, the Eagles' were able to win all three of their opening round games by scores of 2-1 over North Scarborough, 3-0 against Malvern and 6-1 over Woodstock.

Georgetown's undefeated record gained them a spot in the tournament semifinals where they met and defeated a very strong East York squad by the score of 2-1. East

York's goal was scored with less than a minute left in injury time.

The tournament championship featured the Eagles versus West Rouge, an excellent passing team that Georgetown had played to a 2-2 draw in a tournament held earlier in the season. With two quick goals in the first five minutes of play, the Eagles never looked back, winning the final game by a 3-1 score and taking home the championship trophy.

"Only two weeks before, at the Mississauga Soccer Club Tournament, the boys had narrowly missed out playing in the finals by a single goal that was scored in the last 30 seconds of play. With this in mind, you could sense the team was determined not to allow any last minute lapses this time around," said Dom


Halton Hills pitchers dominated throughout the tournament. Jenn Lukas fired a four-hit shutout in a 12-0 win Mississauga North III.
