

## Third candidate seeks Ward 2 seat

There will be another race in the upcoming municipal election with the announcement yesterday (Tuesday) Bryan Lewis will seek a Ward 2 local council seat.

Lewis is the third candidate to enter the race for the two Ward 2 seats. The other contenders are Joan Robson and incumbent Kevin Kuiack.

Lewis, a long-time Georgetown resident, decided to throw his hat in the ring to ensure the concerns of rural communities are heard at council.

"The veil of secrecy must be removed when dealing with rural issues. Residents of rural Halton seem to suffer through intrusions generated from within the larger communities of Halton," said Lewis. "A fair return for the tax dollar investment made by rural residents is essential."

All incumbents, except for Ward 1 Councillor Norm Elliott who is retiring, are running in the November 13 election.

Candidates have until Friday at 5 p.m. to hand in their nomination papers.
