

who would refuse once the ministry announced the tests would not count this year.

"They have legitimate concerns and made some valid points but obviously we're directed by the minister to carry out the testing," Rupka said. "They need to look at this as a learning experience and the minister will provide feedback based on the results. They're good kids but they feel very strongly about this issue, Kids, especially that age, want to know, how does it benefit them?"

He said teachers had relayed to him some comments students had made during preparatory work, so the walkout did not come as a surprise.

Rupka said the students won't be disciplined. Students were asked not to interfere with the testing and they complied, Rupka said. The school did call the parents of the students on the second day of testing, informing them of their child's decision and asking them to keep them at home during the testing.

The students said Wednesday's demonstration was to show their disapproval but also to raise awareness about the testing.

"Obviously Mike Harris isn't going to see us out here today, but unless we do something—writing letters or taking a stand— we won't get our message across," DaSilva said.

Testing was being conducted across the province on Wednesday and Thursday. Acton High School principal Greg MacPherson said the school received permission to postpone the tests until next Wednesday because of the recent train accident that claimed the lives of three high school students from Acton.
