

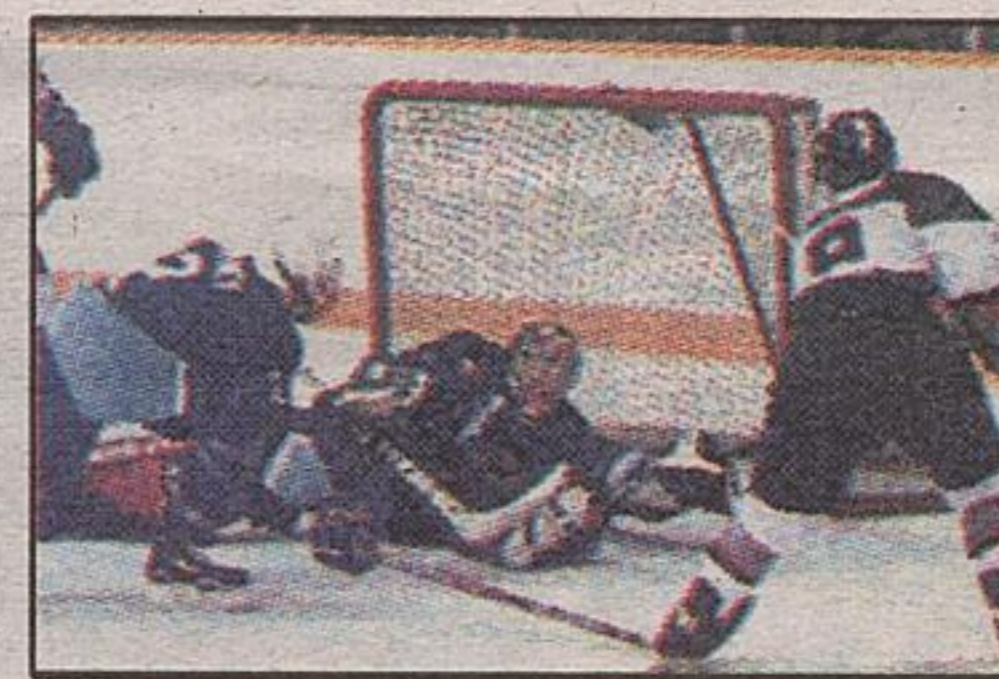

## Campaign 2000

*Municipal election begins with 24 vying for 12 positions*

There will be races for all but four positions in next month's municipal election.

The four candidates who were spared competition are Wards 3/4 regional councillor John Day, Halton District School Board trustee Ethel Gardiner, French Language Separate District School Board (No. 64) Trustee Robert Héту and French Language Public District School Board (No. 58) Trustee Jean Felix Desmarais. They have all been acclaimed. The fate of all other candidates— 24 seeking the remaining 12 positions— will be decided election day Monday, November 13.

Vying for the mayor's job, which pays about \$61,400 a year, are incumbent Marilyn Serjeantson, longtime Ward 2 local councillor Kathy Gastle and former Ward 2 local councillor Robert Heaton.

There are races for all local council seats, which come with a salary of about \$12,000 annually.

Five candidates are going after the two Ward 1 local council seats. There is only one incumbent in that race after veteran Acton Councillor Norm Elliott decided not to run. Candidates are incumbent Clark Somerville, Stephen Grasby, former Acton regional councillor Jake Kuiken, Diane Biggs, and former Halton Hills Hydro commissioner Dobbie Frizzell.

Three area residents are in the race for the two Ward 2 local council seats— incumbent Kevin Kuiack,
