pend A Night in the Black Forest, and enjoy a wild dinner with the Georgetown Bach Chorale on Friday, Oct. 27 at Knox Presbyterian Church in Georgetown.

This fund-raising gourmet dinner, at 7 p.m., will support the Chorale's upcoming trip to Prague, Czech Republic in November and their holiday concert in December.

The 28-member Chorale chamber choir was founded the spring of 1999 when a group of enthused singers came together to perform Johann Sebastian Bach's St. Matthew Passion—regarded by many as the most difficult of that famed composer's choral works. While the Chorale's mandate is to sing Bach's music, they will also perform works of other classical composers.

The group was invited to perform at the Advent Choral Festival in Prague by the Czech Public Radio. This tour, Nov. 21-29, will include four concerts in five days, with the broadcast of one on Czech Public Radio. Other performances will be held in the outdoor Christmas Marketplace and during a church service in a Lutheran Church.

Local musical lovers can get a preview of their Prague repertoire at a concert in Georgetown's Knox Church at 3 p.m. on Sunday, Nov.

As well, during the Wild Boar Dinner, which follows the theme of A Night in the Black Forest, Bach's home region, a mix of musical selections including Beethoven, Schubert, English madrigals and Broadway standards will be performed.

Tickets are \$55 per person for the gourmet dinner.




