Chill Out program in need of commercial space

Chill Out, the program that distributes used clothing to the needy, is searching for donated space in town.

Douglas Wellington, the Chill Out representative for Halton, said they are hoping to launch a Dress for Success program through Chill Out, and some space is needed to run it.

The Dress for Success program, which has been offered successfully in Toronto for a few years, will provide a place for needy adults to find donated business clothing that is organized in specific sizes. Clothing for children will also be available.

"We would be dressing someone to go for a job interview. We are trying to make sure we can supply them with everything," said Wellington.

Wellington said they are looking for a small amount of space in the back of a commercial building or store, preferably in downtown Georgetown, that could possibly be accessible Saturdays. Anyone with space available should call Wellington at 873-9854.

Wellington said, along with the items most needed at this time of year, such as sleeping bags, coats, boots, blankets, hats and mittens, Chill Out needs business wear for both men and women.

He said it would be helpful if those donating business wear marked the bag "Dress for Success."

"I want to thank the community for what they have done," said Wellington about the clothing donated since the program was launched here.

Clothing can be donated to Chill Out, which distributes items locally through Halton Women's Place, Halton Children's Aid Society, Halton Social Services or church referrals, at various donation bins in town.

Locations include Georgetown Marketplace parking lot near Zellers, Penny gas station at the Knolcrest Centre, T & T Auto Repairs at Trafalgar Rd. and 10 Sideroad, the Olon gas station at Trafalgar Rd. and Maple Ave., Silvercreek Service Centre at Hwy. 7 and Trafalgar Rd. N., Arnie's Body Shop on Guelph St. in Norval, and Esso stations at Trafalgar Rd. and Steeles

Ave., Guelph St. and Hwy. 25 north of Hwy. 401. In Acton clothes can be put in bins at Queen's Tire Service Ltd. on Hwy. 7, the parking lot at the former Canadian Tire store, or Beaver gas station on Hwy. 7. Clothing is picked up every Monday.

Any schools interested in having a Chill Out donation bin should call Wellington.

Town to hold environmental workshops

The town will spend \$5,000 and hold three workshops this fall/winter to review efforts being made to protect the environment.

The first of three workshops— all led by a hired consultant— will be held this month and focuses on the Town Environmental Advisory Committee's (TEAC) needs and views about the environment.

The second, which will involve TEAC and town staff, will focus on town operations and ways to enhance the environment.

The third will involve TEAC, council members, region staff, the region's environmental advisory committee, conservation authorities, and other groups to discuss ways to streamline processes, eliminate duplication and "to develop synergy between like-minded organizations to promote strong ecosystem planning," reported Marsha Paley, town planner. The latter two meetings will be held in the new year.

The workshops will also provide some direction to the planners working on the Official Plan review on future environmental policies.
