Burlington resident Brenda Dolling, a retired school teacher, and retired sheet metal worker Albert Tuchel of Georgetown are seeking the NDP nomi-

nation. The candidate will be selected at a nomination meeting at 7:30 p.m. tonight (Wednesday) at the Milton Community Resource Centre.

Brian Penman, president of the PC Riding Association of Halton, said the association will nominate its candidate at a meeting in Milton Saturday morning.

Penman said a number of people have shown interest in being the party's Halton candidate, but would not release

serious injuries and was taken to Milton Hospital then Toronto Western Hospital.


Police say the van, driven by Alex Bicz, 51, the passenger was taken to Guelph General Hospital, treated and released.
