Halton Police seek teens suspected of damaging mailboxes

Talton Regional Police in Halton Hills are Linvestigating the damaging of at least 11 mailboxes in the Wildwood Drive, Eighth Line and 22 Sideroad areas of town.

In one particular incidence, a homeowner reported damage and theft of mail from a mailbox on September 30, at approximately 1:40 a.m. on Wildwood Drive.

The homeowner confronted three white teenage boys who were observed a short time later hitchhiking near his

home. The males would not licence talk to the homeowner when confronted and continued walking.

Police were called and searched the area but the young males could not be found.

In all the other cases, the mailboxes were knocked off their posts causing damage to the boxes and posts.

Halton Police are investigating the theft and recovery of a blue 2000 Dodge Caravan, valued at more than \$25,000. The attached to the STOPPERS vehicle is 765 YSX.

This new van was parked in the driveway of a Langston Crescent, Georgehome

overnight on September 29. The van was locked and the windows were rolled up. The van was parkedwith the front end facing the home. Sometime overnight thieves took the van without alerting the homeowner or

neighbours to their actions.

The van was later recovered in the Belfountain area and had extensive damage done to the front end but, interestingly, the ignition had not been punched to allow use of the vehicle.

Halton Police are investigating an attempted break-in that occurred at the Red Dog Cafe, 129 Mill St., Acton on August 26 at approximately 3:44 a.m.

The bandits shattered the west window with an unknown object and set off an alarm signal. The suspects may have been scared off by the alarm or police attendance a short time later.

Nothing was taken, however, significant damage was done to the window and door frame.
