
The Georgetown Raiders got a hard lesson in missed opportunities.

Coming off a key 6-4 road win over the Brampton Capitals on Thursday, the Raiders handed the points back by dropping a 3-2 decision to eighth-placed Bramalea on Saturday. Monday they fell 7-4 to Buffalo, allowing the Lightning to pull even in the standings.

The result is in the space of four days, the Raiders tumbled from first in the Provincial Jr. A West Conference to a fourth-place tie. It's not quite as bad as it sounds as they are still only two points off the pace. But it goes to show they can't afford to pass up points against the weak teams.

That's exactly what they did when they let one slip away on Saturday. They let Bramalea (5-8-2) jump out to a 2-0 lead. Mike Knoepfli and Scott MacDonald pulled them even at two but a defensive giveaway led to the win-

ner in the third period.

Alex Macdonell, Stace Page, Scott MacDonald and Dane Dainard scored against Buffalo and Matt Fielding stopped 26 of 32 shots in his first start with the Raiders. Andrew Reynolds, who had a 4.09 average in 10 games, is no longer with the team.

The Raiders play in Burlington on Friday and host Brampton on Saturday. Game time is pushed back one hour to 8:30 p.m.


